"2014 Season Round-up"

elcome to the fourth newsletter of 2014. This final publication for 2014 covers the period starting 19th July.

Middlesbrough B-Level Tournament -19th July

David and Jean Ball attended one of the more distant B-Level Tournaments when they travelled to Middlesbrough. The weather was rather damp and humid for much of the day.

The twelve players were put into a Swiss draw and after the first two rounds the leaderboard looked like it would produce an outright winner fairly easily, and by lunchtime David and Jean had edged ahead of Margaret Cowman from Ripon Spa.


Unfortunately David and Jean's progress slipped a little and by the end of the day the results showed Margaret Cowman and Colin Green from Tyneside both with five wins out of six and 38 hoop points scored, so a playoff was required and won by Colin Green. David ended up third and Jean was fifth.

Well done to both for waving the LLCC flag in one of the most northern clubs we have yet visited - only Belsay Hall, north of Newcastle, is the most distant club we have played at - an Inter-Club Shield round back in 2010.

Hamptworth B-Level - 26th July

The next B-Level that some of our members attended was at Hamptworth near Southampton. Ross Bagni supplied the transport on a very hot day for John Cundell, John Thorp and Richard Keighley. Departing at 6.30am we arrived at Hamptworth Golf and Country Club at 9.00am perfectly timed for the briefing.

There are five lawns in a pleasant setting in a vale below

the golf clubhouse. The lawns were cut extremely short and were very fast which made positioning a bit of a lottery. There were 16 players drawn into four heats of four. These blocks were to be played before lunch. Our players were all in separate blocks. Some of the blocks were completed within a couple of hours – however others took until around 2.00pm! John Thorp won his block; Richard and John C were runners up in theirs.

After lunch, play restarted at 3.00pm! The weather was even hotter with hardly a breath of wind. The first and second players in each round played their opposite numbers from different blocks as quarter finalists. John C and Richard Keighley were successful and got through to the semi finals. They were then drawn to play one another. John C was more fortunate with lawn positioning than Richard and won 7-3 to get through to the final. Richard was to play Kath Wright for third and fourth places.

John C was playing Chris Heath from Guildford and Godalming club, The match see-sawed from one hoop to the next with both players really struggling to gain positions on the unpredictable lawn surface. Chris managed a fine hoop jawsing on the 12th and both John's balls were in no position to remove or jump him - Chris winning 7-5.

Richard Keighley scored a good win over Kath Wright. By now it was approaching 6.30pm – a long, hot day – as organiser Richard Jenkins annouced the results. First was Chris Heath from Guildford and Godalming – John C was second, Richard was third. In the play offs that had been continuing during the quarters, semis and final, John T finished 7th and Ross Bagni 11th.

At this stage of the season we had David Ball and John Cundell qualified for the October National Final.

Wingrave v Phyllis Court - 25th July

Wingrave CC play in the Southern Croquet Federation's Handicap League North against Blewbury, Dogmersfield, High Wycombe and two Phyllis Court teams. As they only have one lawn, Wingrave have to play all their home games 'away'. Obviously somewhat of a disadvantage. Therefore in 2013 they hired our lawns for their home match against High Wycombe, and decided to repeat the process against Phyllis Court this year.

The Southern Federation's competition is rather different from our EACF Handicap League as there are four doubles games and only eight singles. The other major change to our format is a 13.00 hours start. This was somewhat delayed as Phyllis Court players were delayed by traffic, and with untimed games, play didn't finish until the early evening! B-Level Edgbaston - 9th September



Lawn Maintenance, Equipment, Storage

As most members know, the club is now responsible for all maintenance work on the lawns that is required during the closed season - plus the normal work that we undertake during the playing season. The Council groundsmen mow for us once a week during the playing season and mark the white lines. Any other treatment is down to us, either doing it ourselves or paying others to carry out the work.

2012 was a big learning curve for us and the awful wet 2012 summer and the cold winter which followed made work quite difficult. Our small group managed to carry out scarification, aeration, an attempt to control the large moss problem due to the wet conditions, plus winter mowing where necessary.

We contracted the Council to carry out worm and weed control as we did not have the necessary equipment for these tasks.

John Thorp and John Cundell took advice from some of the clubs that we visit that have superb lawns, and following further discussion with the Council Groundsman Doug Bolton, we carried out the following programme in 2013/2014 winter.

In early October John C and John T were instructed on how to use the Council's tining machine which punches holes and aerates the lawns, and they proceeded to hollow tine all three lawns. Following them were Ross Bagni, David Ball, Len Buckingham, Malcolm Kirby, Peggy Kenny and Roger Stroud to collect up all the removed cores.

The 'mossy' areas of lawns one and two were 'verticut' and then scarified. In the afternoon, the two Johns applied slow release fertiliser to all three lawns, borrowing the Council's spreader. After this lawn one was re-seeded as were the mossy areas of lawn two. As the dry weather held overnight, the following morning the two Johns re-seeded lawns two and three and applied 24 bags of top dressing to the poor left hand side of lawn one, to the 'bumpy' area between hoops three and four on lawn two and to other selected areas

We also utilised some of the cores to fill in the two dips at the top of hoop two on lawn two. These areas were destined to be rolled over the winter months.

In all some 40 hours work from these eight members. John Thorp and John Cundell would like to thank the six others for their valuable help that is much appreciated. We would also like to thank the Council's Groundsman, Doug Bolton, for his assistance in helping us to get the use of the Council's equipment.

Up to the end of the year, the two John's carried out moss treatment, rolling and top dressing of the filled areas on lawn two which have responded very well, aeration of mossy areas, swishing to remove worm casts, and leaf clearance. All lawns were moved twice. This work amounted to another 36 hours!

The Christmas and New Year period was very wet and there was little chance to get on the lawns. As soon as this was possible we mowed again, and as the new season approached, applied a slow release fertiliser, carried out a light scarification and added some moss control.

As the season started we were reasonably pleased with the extra work we had carried out on the left hand third of lawn one to remove some of the bumps and encourage more grass growth. It was very frustrating and annoying when a group of inconsiderate teenage boys and girls decided to play football in wet conditions and undid all our good work in a short time. This caused emergency repairs with us purchasing and adding top dressing to fill the holes, and the neccessity of asking Doug Bolton to run the cricket roller over the bumpy surface. Heavy rolling is NOT recommended for croquet lawns, however we had no option and managed to prepare a reasonable surface for the season.

The weather has been very kind this year and the warmth and lack of rain has helped the moss situation.

We will be starting a similar programme for the coming months, where the main work will be on aeration, scarifying, fertiliser and weed control, moss control, top dressing and re-seeding with a finer dwarf rye variety.

We were pleased that the allocation of the Referees Room/Dressing Room as a storage arrangement for our maintenance equipment and some playing equipment again worked reasonably well this year. Now that some of the football has been moved to to Astral Park, we have approached the Council for permanent use of the Referees Room for storage and as a small committee/meeting room.

Keeping Fit!

Roger Stroud informs us that Caroline Stroud carried a pedometer around the lawns at a recent friendly, and recorded five miles - including the walk to and from the little car park.
