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"Another Year - Another Season Beckons - Roll on March!"

New Year to all members and friends. In the first newsletter of 2011 we looked ahead to a busy year and better play from our third lawn. The busy year certainly transpired and as well as all our 'normal' club and friendly events, including a new competition for the over 70's, we ran two League teams, both of which enjoyed excellent form and results; took part in the Inter-Club Murphy Shield; won back the Hunstanton Leighton-Linslade Golf Croquet Challenge Trophy; and a number of members entered 'open' events at clubs ranging from Watford, Wrest Park, Newport, Ipswich, Hunstanton, Birmingham and Nottingham - and some impressive results were gained.

The third lawn was much improved and is now probably our most level surface. Lawns 1 and 2 suffer from being the two nearest to the clubhouse so they tend to be over used - the remedy is obvious! We also suffered early in the year from the dandelion plague, however considerable hard work digging out the little devils by a few dedicated members - notably John Thorp and Pauline Lefrere - plus some spray treatment by Council Groundstaff helped; then came the drought! More about the lawns later.

Members who attended the AGM will have been brought up to date as to what has been a busy year behind the scenes; a full report on the AGM follows.

Annual General Meeting

The 12th Annual General Meeting was held at Northall Village Hall on Friday 11th November 2011, and the meeting started promptly at 7.30pm as our Chairman David Ball welcomed some 37 members, plus our invited guests – Leighton-Linslade Town Mayor Gordon Perham and his wife Carole. Secretary Roger Stroud then gave nine apologies for absence.

In Matters Arising from last year's minutes Tom Miller

reported to the meeting that following the request at the 2010 AGM for a survey to determine the average age of the membership, this came out as 72. The minutes of the 2010 AGM were then duly approved.

We had circulated the Officer's Reports with the AGM Agenda Pack before the meeting therefore they were not repeated verbatim, but updated as appropriate.

David Ball emphasised that there were a few members who do an awful lot of work behind the scene – for instance the six members who had scarified and mowed the lawns recently, saving the club some £600. There are many more lawn maintenance tasks to perform during the forthcoming close season and David asked the meeting to show their appreciation in the normal manner. He also asked for similar acknowledgement for all those who carry out the other duties required to keep the club running smoothly.

Roger Stroud stated that due to a number of reasons he had not been able to perform normal secretarial duties this year and he thanked John Cundell for taking over as Acting Secretary. He felt that our membership fee was very good value in terms of what we get for our money – good social play and good competitive play for those who desire it, and that members should bear this in mind in the future. He thanked Tony Wells for his five years of committee membership. He also thanked John Cundell for the newsletter which is enjoyed not only by our members, but also by other clubs who enjoy reading our news which is published on the EACF website.

The Treasurer Len Buckingham then reminded members that they had already received the uncertified accounts a few days previously for perusal, and that these had now been certified by our Examiner, Marjorie Cliffe. There was a query concerning the Referees course that was answered by the Treasurer. Len Buckingham stated he intended to approach the Town Council to investigate if there was any

chance of our annual 5% increase in Licence Fee being reduced. He was not aware of any imminent increase in the Croquet Association membership fee. He reminded members that now we are responsible for our out-of-

season lawn maintenance – we have so far spent approximately £830 this winter for lawn treatment. We will try to raise money by various means; grants; social club that shows a profit and it would be nice to see increased attendance; and possibly a car boot sale at the beginning of next season. It is also proposed to organise Corporate events – if this can be arranged then we will need support and help from the membership to make these successful.

The committee has requested an increase in membership fee of £5 to a total of £70. There were no objections to this and the proposal was accepted by the meeting.



There was a query about Junior Membership fees which will be considered at the next Committee Meeting.

Len also stated that we are currently investigating purchase of a self-propelled rotary mower for out-of-season work, and that we had approached the Council about storage of all the extra equipment we now have, and will need, to carry out our own maintenance.

The Officers' reports were duly accepted by the meeting. The Chairman then thanked the Vice-Chairman John Cundell, the Officers, and all members of the Committee for their sterling efforts in the last year. He also thanked Marjorie Cliffe who examines our accounts and stated that she was willing to continue this for another year.

David Ball then conducted the appointment of the Officers and new Committee. Malcolm Kirby was proposed and seconded and approved as a new committee member. The appointments are below.

Margaret Brown commented that she was very concerned that there were very few female members on the committee. David stated that there were no extra nominations from the membership and perhaps the ladies would take this comment on board for future years.



Leighton-Linslade Social Club

The Wednesday morning social club is meeting regularly during the close season at Page's Park pavilion from 10.00am to 12.00, and on average a dozen or so members have been present. The fee is £2, and for that you get refreshments and the opportunity to play many board games, darts, snooker, dominoes and cribbage. The activities generally finish about noon, and the hall is already warm on arrival, so please support this venture if you possibly can. Friends of members are welcome for the same attendance fee.

Annual Dinner

This year's dinner will be at Leighton Buzzard Golf Club, Plantation Road on Friday 23rd March. Forms were distributed at the AGM and by post thereafter. There are no more spaces.

Soham Indoor

The annual Soham Indoor Golf Croquet weekend will be on 10/11th March. Saturday will be handicapped play, Sunday will be level. We can have two teams of two players each on both days. Cost is £30 per doubles team. If you are interested in taking part then please contact me (John Cundell) asap.

Coaches Training Course

This course over the weekend of 14/15th April, to be held at Letchworth, is for relatively experienced players who wish to become Golf Croquet coaches. The Manager is our Richard Keighley, assisted by John Cundell and coaches from other clubs.

EACF Club Champions Tournament

This is a new event at Newport on 29th April. Each club in the region is invited to send both their level play and handicap club champions from the previous year or suitable substitute, to play on an overall knockout tournament to determine a Regional Champion. Our participants will be Roger Stroud in the Handicap event and Jean Ball in the Level.

EACF High Handicap Tournament

This event is aimed specifically for those players whose handicap falls between 8-12, to give the less experienced player a chance to play in open competition locally, hopefully to tempt them into entering into a more senior Croquet Association event. This should go some way to filling the gaps left by the old National Trust Days which were previously held at Ickworth Hall prior to 1997. The

date is 24th June and the venue is Bury St. Edmunds.

Possible New Competition

There is a possibility that for 2012 there will be two EACF League competitions - the existing one for Handicap play will remain - however organiser Chris Howell is considering adding a Level play League aimed at the more senior/experienced players. We have expressed our strong interest for this and await developments.

Hunstanton Invitation Weekend

This is an annual open event at Hunstanton over 6/7th August. (This is not our annual Friendly event). Saturday is all Singles in two sections - (A) Level play for lower handicaps; and (B) Handicap play. Sunday is Pro-am Doubles where partners will be allocated by the club as per Handicap. The entry fee is £10 per player per day which includes light refreshments. For an application form go to www.hunstantoncroquetclub.co.uk.

Selection Committee

The general consensus from members was that the 'selection committee' arrangement for last year was successful and the committee has agreed that it will continue for 2012. The committee members are Len Buckingham, John Cundell, Eve Buckingham, George Lawson and John Thorp.

Postage costs are now very expensive and as club outgoings are going to rise now that we will be doing some of our own lawn maintenance, then every penny we can save is important.

Lawn Maintenance and Equipment Storage

At the close of the season five members took eight hours over two days to scarify the lawns.

Shortly before the end of the season our contractor killed off the poor grass at the right hand third of Lawn 2, and two weeks later, deeply scarified the area, removed the dead material, and re-seeded with grass recommended for croquet lawns. At the same time Lawns 1 and 2 were aerated and fertiliser was applied to all three.

In early November the two Johns rotary-mowed all three

lawns as the grass has been growing well due to the warm Autumn/Winter. Len Buckingham kindly loaned his mower which has not taken too kindly to the heavy demand. We have also cleared leaves as required and attempted to break up wormcasts. We are pleased to report that the warm conditions have allowed the new seed to germinate and there is already a healthy sward on the refurbished area. Whether this will be ready for the start of the season will depend on what the climate throws at us over the next few months.

We are pleased to report that after further negotiation with the Town Council, the off-season rotary mowing will now be carried out by Senior Groundsman Doug Bolton and his staff. Further necessary treatment as required will also be handled by the Town Council following requests from us, at costs to be determined.

We are also pleased to be able to report that we have been allocated a storage arrangement for our maintenance equipment and some playing equipment which will enable us to create more space in the clubroom.

Finally, at the end of December a path was laid by the groundstaff starting at the concrete slab outside our clubroom around to the toilets and the path on the cricket side of the pavilion.

Our Lawn Rent arrangements allow for playing sessions to be flexible to work around the weather - either good or bad - e.g., if morning is wet we can regroup pm or even on another day; if good then stay on as required. Also, members are able to go along for practice sessions at will.

The only provisos are that a) if the Council Groundstaff or any Contractors or our own members are working on the lawns, then they will have priority and players will have to wait until they are finished; and b) certain Mondays and Fridays when League and Friendly matches are scheduled when no club play will be possible.
