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“A New Year - A New Start?”

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2011. Happy New Year to all members and friends. In the first newsletter of 2010 we looked ahead to a busy year and the inauguration of our third lawn. The busy year certainly transpired and as well as all our ‘normal’ club and friendly events, we ran two League teams, took part in the new Inter-Club Murphy Shield where we narrowly lost the quarter final at Belsay Hall near Newcastle, and a number of members entered ‘open’ events at clubs ranging from south of the Thames to Ipswich, Hunstanton, Birmingham and Nottingham.

The third lawn was available shortly after the season started but unfortunately a combination of very wet weather in the late Winter, some vandalism and a plague of dandelions meant that the surface was not quite up to a good playing standard.

Members who attended the AGM will have been brought up to date as to what has been a momentous year behind the scenes, during which Tom Miller and Richard Keighley have been involved in complicated and far reaching meetings with the Town Council concerning the future of our club. The information update that was given at the AGM by Tom Miller is reported here and every member is requested to take note as the eventual outcome of the meetings and the subsequent agreement - which we are hopeful will be in place before the start of this season, will affect all members.

Club happenings since the last newsletter in October 2010 were all off the lawns - the award of a Croquet Association Diploma to John Cundell on 16th October, and also a ‘Service Towards Sport Award’ to John from the Leighton Linslade Sports Council in January; the Annual General Meeting on November 12th; and the indoor golf croquet competition at Soham on 13/14th November.

The Croquet Association AGM - and CA Diploma for John Cundell

Members will recall from the previous newsletter the following paragraphs from Roger Stroud.

“During the summer myself and Tom Miller felt it appropriate to nominate John for a Croquet Association Diploma for his services to both our club and also the Croquet Association. Our nomination read as follows:

John is the Vice Chairman of our club and is a driving force behind everything that we do. This includes clubhouse and courts maintenance and internal and external competitions organiser. He is a CA and club coach and our club handicapper. John also assists with coaching at other clubs. Prior to matches or tournaments, he can always be seen checking the condition of the courts and the precise measurement of the hoops. On match morning he is invariably first there, putting up gazebos and making

any other last minute preparations.

During the past four years, he has been actively involved in the development of the courts from two overlapping courts to our current position of three full size, fenced courts. Our courts are part of a public park and John has developed a good working relationship with the Town Council groundstaff, to ensure on-going court maintenance, achieving a good standard for EACF league and CA Inter Club matches.

John has also produced the club's respected quarterly newsletter since January 2004.

Earlier this year John - jointly with another of our members, Richard Keighley, updated the CA ‘Guide to Golf Croquet’.

John's commitment and enthusiasm for the game of

croquet, plus his service to the Leighton-Linslade Croquet Club and the wider croquet community, is an inspiration to all.

We recently heard from the CA that John has been awarded a diploma and would be presented with it at the CA AGM at The Hurlingham Club on October 16th, accompanied by Judith.”

Thank you Roger for your kind words which are much appreciated.

So, on the fine Saturday morning of 16th October, Judith and myself drove down to the Hurlingham Club which borders the Thames in Fulham and is set in 42 acres of magnificent grounds. The Hurlingham Club is a green oasis of tradition and international renown, recognised throughout the world as one of Britain’s greatest private members’ clubs. It retains its quintessentially English traditions and heritage, while providing modern facilities and services for its members – including of course some fine croquet facilities. We were very politely directed to the parking area a few yards from the fine headquarters of the house. At reception we asked directions to the meeting room, and a few moments later we met a contingent of six Watford players including Roger Nicholls and Janet Lewis – and were pleased to find out that Janet was also to be awarded a CA Diploma for the good work she has carried out for Watford club during her 14 years membership. So after a refreshing drink in one of the many restaurants/cafes in the club, we made our way to the meeting room – a beautiful room packed with CA members. We did not make an exact count but a rough estimation was at least 70 members.

The President, Quiller Barrett opened the meeting promptly at 11.00am and smoothly and efficiently took the meeting through the Chairman Patricia Duke-Cox’s report; the presentation of Accounts; election of Secretary, Treasurer, Accountant; and then voting on some changes to the CA Constitution – mainly procedural matters on voting rights for Individual Associates and Member Clubs. He then moved on to election of Council Members before we got to the presentations part of the meeting. All the above was handled within 45 minutes.

Initially there were presentations to Most Improved Players – most of these being Association players, followed

by Coach of the Year award and Council medals to those who have given long service to the CA Council. We then got to the award of the Diplomas – there were twenty presented and for alphabetical reasons I was the first up to be presented with the Diploma by Quiller Barrett who gave a brief resume of the accompanying notes about each recipient – which were also supplied printed in full for all members present. Shortly after me, Watford’s Janet Lewis received her Diploma. Other recipients came from Weston Super Mare, Northampton, Durham, Ashby, Canterbury, Cheltenham, Sussex County, Southport & Birkdale, Llanfairfechan, Woking, Crawley, Bowden, Tyneside and Dyffryn.

Finally, Keith Aiton who was Captain of the Great Britain team that recently won the MacRobertson Shield, an absolutely magnificent trophy, was again congratulated on the fine and excitingly close win, and he was very magnanimous in his praise and thanks for all who had helped the event to be such a success. (This competition is regarded as the Association Croquet World Team Championship and has been played 20 times since 1925 with Great Britain winning on eight occasions previous to 2010 – no pressure then! The other teams came from Australia, New Zealand, and the United States.)

The meeting closed just after 12.15pm and we made our way outside for the official and unofficial photographs to be taken, then it was off to the bar and restaurant for lunch, following which Janet Lewis, who has played Association games at Hurlingham, took us on a guided tour round the grounds – very impressive. Taking leave of our good friends from Watford, we made our way back along the A4/M4/M25 having enjoyed a super day.

Once again I would thank Roger and the committee for putting my name forward for this award. I am very honoured and hope that the award helps in some small way to put our club further forward on the Croquet map. I am also well aware that there are a number of people in our club who I consider are more deserving than myself and that the award is also in some small way a thanks to them as well.

Annual General Meeting

The 11th Annual General Meeting was held at Northall

Village Hall on Friday 12th November 2010, and the meeting started promptly at 7.30pm as our Chairman Tom Miller welcomed some 31 members and our Examiner of Accounts, Marjorie Cliffe. Secretary Roger Stroud then gave 17 apologies for absence.

The Minutes of the 2009 AGM were duly approved. We had circulated the Officer's Reports together with the last 2010 newsletter before the AGM therefore they were not repeated verbatim at the meeting, but updated as appropriate. Accordingly Chairman Tom initially apologised that his report was a bit lengthy due to what has been a difficult year - the main reasons of which had been detailed in his written report. However before continuing with the update, he wished to pay tribute to Len Buckingham and Tony Wells who had a difficult year with hospital problems, and Roger Stroud with house problems, and had soldiered on in their club roles.

Tom outlined the problem we encountered at the beginning of the year with respect to the Social Club where we were informed by the Town Council that the hire fee was to rise retrospectively by a large amount. Tom presented our case to the Leisure and Community Committee and thankfully the increase was rescinded until April 2010. For this Winter Tom presented an amended strategy to the L&C Committee in October - after information was gained by Len, Tony Stammers and John Cundell on alternative venues. The L&CC resolved that we would be charged an increase of 2% until April 2011, and then 5% until April 2012 - which all concerned considered was a good result.

Tom then moved on to our endeavours to obtain a written agreement with the Town Council to give us some security of tenure beyond the single season. At the meeting with the Town Council in September, Tom Miller and Richard Keighley were informed that the Council would prefer us to pay a peppercorn rent, but to look after all the required maintenance - mowing, lawn treatment, and responsibility for vandalism. At the September meeting of your committee it was decided that we could not accept the

vandalism aspect of the agreement but we would investigate other details of the option.

A great deal of work has gone on behind the scenes, and there are many pros and cons that were considered; in particular we decided that we would have to contract the work out and not attempt to do it ourselves - however if we did this the annual subscription would have to rise to £125 each and if we lost any members this would rise further. Therefore we looked at a hybrid approach with the club looking after the treatment of the lawns - scarifying, weed treatment, fertilising, and white lining - whilst the Council would continue to mow and water the lawns and maintain the fencing.

We calculated that this approach could mean a subscription rise to £76 per annum. John Cundell had investigated the subscriptions of 17 other clubs and has deduced that the average is around £112.

Tom and Richard met with the Town Council a few days prior to the AGM and after considerable discussion the club offered to look after the treatment of the lawns as described above and pay a lump sum as we have done in previous years, with a 5% increase per annum over the period of the agreement - with the TC looking after the mowing and watering. On the afternoon prior to the AGM the TC had agreed to our proposal in principal and had redrafted the agreement for our consideration.

There followed a fairly lengthy question, answers and comments session from members to Tom, Richard, Len, and John, covering many of the ramifications of the agreement which are considerable - white lining, mower costs, storage, maintenance, labour availability, etc. Following this it was considered that a good deal had been obtained for members. Therefore the meeting endorsed the redrafted agreement. (Subsequently since the AGM we understand this has been sent to their lawyers.) If the legal draft is then satisfactory to us the agreement will go to the respective L&CC meeting for discussion/approval in February, which Tom intends to attend on the Club's behalf. The intention is that the agreement takes effect

from 1st April and will be for six years.

Tom announced he would be retiring as Chairman from the AGM but stated that he is willing to continue, along with Richard, the progress of the agreement with the TC as required. A proposal from David Ball to accept the Chairman's Report and statement to the meeting was seconded by John Thorp and accepted unanimously.

Secretary Roger Stroud thanked Tom Miller and Richard Keighley for the immense work they had carried out for well over a year now, with support from other members, in the negotiations with the TC which should give us a fine base for the future.

Roger also remarked that our newsletter is very well respected and enjoyed not only by our club members, but by many other clubs. It was this that prompted Roger, assisted by Tom, to approach the Croquet Association to suggest John Cundell be awarded a CA Diploma, that he was duly presented with at the CA AGM in October.

The Treasurer also started his report by stating that all members owed an awful lot to Tom and Richard for their superb work. He then presented examined accounts for the period to 31st October 2010. The closing balance was satisfactory and our careful strategy for many years would now assist with the extra costs to be entailed by our new relationship with the TC. He then stated that the initial subscription proposal in his written report would probably result in a shortfall but this could be covered initially by our capital balance.

Also in 2011 we will be paying the full Croquet Association levy as was agreed at previous AGMs; this is considered better value than individual insurance fees that would otherwise be necessary.

He also remarked on the excellent flexibility we have in being able to play at any time. The membership fee for 2012 will depend on our actual costs for 2011. **The proposal for 2011 subscription fee of £65 was seconded and agreed unanimously.**

Marjorie Cliffe kindly agreed to stand as our Accounts Examiner once again and was duly proposed, seconded and passed unanimously.

The Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were then duly proposed, seconded and also accepted by the meeting unanimously.

Tom then stated that he was retiring and that David Ball had been nominated as Chairman and was duly elected unanimously. David stated he was honoured to serve.

Finally we presented Marjorie with a horticultural gift for acting as our Examiner and presenting the awards – and it was stated that a similar gift had been made to Diana Phelps a day previously for graciously allowing us to invade her house and garden for the Annual Garden Party.

In Any Other Business Tony Stammers was thanked for organising a very successful raffle and David Ball gave details for the Annual Dinner and booking forms were handed out at the meeting and sent to other members afterwards by email and letter.

Tom closed the meeting by stating that he was absolutely delighted with the gift and that he had considered it an honour to be Chairman over the last two years, but also that he was now looking forward to returning to 'the back benches'.

He reminded us that at last year's AGM he had referred to a statement by the Chairman of Letchworth CC that our club is a beacon for collective contribution to running a club. At the end of the recent meeting with the Town Council the Deputy Town Clerk had remarked that our approach had been very honourable. Tom concluded by saying that if we are known as an honourable club that was more than enough for him and was a great reflection on our members.

David Ball's closing remarks asked for a further round of applause for Tom and Richard's work. David then remarked on what an excellent season we had enjoyed with respect to three lawns; 'A' and 'B' teams in the League – 'A' just missing out on the area win and 'B' with a good run at the end; we travelled to Newcastle for the Inter Club Shield; purchased equipment for hoop setting and lawn plugging; travelled to CA matches at Nottingham, Watford, Edgbaston; friendlies at Hunstanton, Littlehampton, Watford, Stony Stratford, Northampton; indoor at Soham; the update of the 'Guide to Golf Croquet' by Richard and John; plus a lot of fun, enjoyment and competitive and social play; culminating in the CA Diploma to John.
