Prospects for the season

Weather permitting, it is hoped to make the lawns available for play by members from Sunday 1st April although this will depend on final agreement from the ground staff, but the Official Opening (see below) will not

take place until 14th April.

The Committee hopes that some members may like to become coaches or referees. Weekend courses for prospective coaches are to take place at Newport (Essex) on 28th/29th April, each at a modest fee of £10. There is a one day course for referees at Phyllis Court, Henley on 23rd April with a fee of £8. Further information available from the Secretary.

Last season, there was little take up of places for the National Trust tournaments at Ickworth. In the circumstances, the Committee only proposes to apply for places for 2007 if members indicate they would like to take part by 27th April latest. Entry Fee is £5 per pair and £3 per person for the singles. Please see calendar for dates.

It is proposed to invite players from other local clubs to join in a tournament organized on 'Grass Roots' lines for beginners and high handicappers. No date yet fixed.

Some details of EACF League fixtures have been received and are included in the diary. Other fixtures are awaited. The Committee proposes to adopt a policy of selecting the strongest available team, by reference to handicap and perhaps form, for each match. Members who wish to be considered for selection by John, Len & Tony will be invited to enroll at the beginning of the season by way of a notice in the clubroom.

Various B Class tournaments (players of say 4-1 handicaps) are being organised for good Club players by the Croquet Association or local Federations. If you are interested, please notify the Secretary.

The Committee agreed that in addition to the usual playing sessions of Tuesday afternoon (Singles Handicap), Wednesday and Thursday mornings, Saturday and Sunday afternoons - that we will try an evening session during the high summer months of June, July and August - from say 6.00pm onwards. First suggestion is for Wednesday evenings, however more on this as the season progresses.

Finally, we have just heard that the contractor will commence work on the extension of the lawns in the week beginning 23rd April, weather and ground conditions permitting. We are hopeful that play can continue as per normal on the existing lawns whilst this work is going on, however we would ask all members to be careful when work is in progress.

Opening Day

Preparations are well in hand for the opening of the 2007 season on Saturday 14th April at 2pm when Town Mayor Mark Freeman has agreed to strike the first ball in accordance with a well-established and much appreciated tradition. Members are expected to turn up in great numbers to celebrate the occasion.

School Sports Partnership

Our Club has committed itself to introduce croquet to pupils of local schools. On 27th April, there is to be a Family Games and Social Evening at Leighton Middle School and four Committee members are to supervise croquet 'taster' sessions for pupils and parents alike. Another local school has expressed interest in our initiative and four volunteer members, who have already coached at the Middle School, are applying for official approval to enable them to commence coaching sessions at Pages Park. If any other members are interested in helping out, please let the Secretary know.
