"Busy - Damp - But a Very Enjoyable Season!"



elcome to the fourth newsletter of 2007 under the Editorship of John Cundell for this issue as Richard is currently walking the Lakes! It's been an interesting and busy season and October seems to have come around much too quickly. The weather has been a little unkind however we have been fairly lucky with most of our matches - and all that water has helped to provide the best-looking lawns we have ever had at Pages Park. So, without more ado, we will start off with a round-up of the remaining season match reports since our July newsletter.

Match Reports

Club Handicap Singles - This competition on Saturday 21st July, attracted sixteen keen members - an increase from twelve in 2006 - who were drawn into two blocks, each competitor playing seven games. The top two from each block went into semi-finals, and after some very hard fought games, Roger Stroud beat Sheila Beal (7-6), and Len Buckingham beat Bryan Ferris (7-2). Winslow Away was at Home! - On 27th July, we played host to members of Winslow Croquet Club. By rights, the match ought to have taken place at Winslow but the lawn there had been re-seeded and was not ready for play, and unhappily their club shelter had also been vandalised.

The home team comprised the pairings of Sally Clay with Tony Wells and Yvonne Banks with Valerie Jeffers. Sally and Tony won all their three games and 2-1 in favour of Yvonne and Valerie gave the match result of 5-1 a rather one-sided look. However, the games had been closely contested and the Winslow players expressed their appreciation for the warm hospitality they had been given. **EACF League - Letchworth and Finals -** On a perfect day for croquet with bright sunshine and a light breeze, members welcomed a team from Letchworth to Pages Park

for an all-important league match.

The home team comprised Eve Buckingham, Sally Clay, Valerie Jeffers and Richard Keighley. The format was that each team member had to play a timed and best of 13 hoops singles game against all four opponents. Handicaps were applied. After each of the first three rounds, the





scores were level, but Leighton-Linslade drew clear in the final round of singles to lead by 9 games to 7. Eve Buckingham had played consistently well and had won all her four games. Valerie and Richard had won two each and

Sally had won one. The match concluded with two doubles games with the players knowing that Letchworth had to win both to force a shoot out at the centre peg to decide the match. Fortunately this was not necessary as Sally and Richard won their game convincingly by six hoops to two, whilst Eve and Valerie slipped to 1-3 defeat. The win by ten games to eight meant that Leighton-Linslade had drawn level with league leaders Watford, who at that stage had one match to play.

Unfortunately for us, Watford went on to win that match and so had an unbeaten record in our group - they were the only team to beat us.

The winners of the four areas were Downham Market who played Enfield in one semi-final, and Sudbury who were meant to play Watford in the second semi-final. Enfield won their match, however Sudbury withdrew at the last minute, leaving Watford to contest the Final which they won by 10-8. We were certainly in one of, if not the strongest group, so should not be disappointed that we lost that one vital game against Watford earlier in the season.

This was an enjoyable league season and our games were organised by John Cundell, with impartial refereeing by Len Buckingham, unflustered timekeeping by George Lawson and the watchful enthusiasm of a number of scorers, including Diana Phelps, Tony Stammers, Irene Davis and Sheila Beal.

Next year, proposals have been submitted to the EACF that the number of games should be increased to home and away fixtures for each match, and that some consideration should be given to removing the time limit which spoils handicap games, and is also very difficult of apply where doubling up on lawns is required.

Watford Clean Sweep! - Earlier in the season our Away Friendly at Watford was won by them with 9-7 games - and then they won our first League match of the season as mentioned above - so it was with determination that 8-9 members entertained Watford at Pages Park on Friday 17th August with a view to exacting revenge!

to play one 13 hoop game against the four opposition pairs. Sally Clay and Una Pengelly won a convincing three of their four games; Bryan Ferris and Sheila Beal won two and were very unlucky to lose their other two games; whilst the usually strong and reliable pairing of Eve and Len Buckingham suffered an 'off-day' with one win. Also scoring one was the pairing of Yvonne Banks and either Tony Stammers or Diana Phelps who shared their four games due to injury problems. So the final result was another 9-7 defeat by Watford who went away jubilant. We will get our revenge next season!

Honours Even with Stony Stratford - The last 'Friendly' match of the season was played against Stony Stratford Croquet Club at Pages Park on Friday 31st August.

The weather was cool but kind and the playing surface excellent apart from the flurries of early Autumn leaves which were removed with the help of a couple of air blowers kindly loaned to us by the Council's groundstaff. In the usual 'Friendly' format each pair of players had to play one 13 hoop game against the four opposition pairs. The duo of Sally Clay and Una Pengelly, and that of Eve Buckingham and John Cundell, were not up to their usual competitive standard, and both pairs managed one win each. Bryan Ferris and Yvonne Banks faired better with two wins from their four games - however the 'star' pair were Margaret Brown and Tony Wells with an invincible four wins out of four.

The overall result was therefore eight wins to Leighton Linslade and an equal eight to Stony Stratford - so no-one went away disappointed.

Centre Stage Finals - This event took place at Edgbaston Croquet Club on Saturday 8th September and our representative was George Lawson, who was runnerup in our club qualifying event.

George reports that ten members of various clubs were split into two blocks of five - all with handicaps of 2, 3 or 4. There were three lawns and one was double banked and everyone played on it once. The system used was a trifle complicated as hoop 3 on the normal layout became hoop 1 on the double-banked circuit! The games were timed at 60 minutes but no-one needed this.

They were both tight games and each was won by 7-4, who incidentally were the two block winners.

The final was a very tight game of nip and tuck right up to five each when the eventual winner took the eleventh hoop and the other player unfortunately hit the centre peg when going for hoop 12 - leaving Ian Morrison from Bath to finish 7-5. Runner up was Roger Bathley from a club in Hampshire.

George enjoyed the day which was well organised and is looking forward to getting there again next year. Well done George.

And this date could not be changed! So some quick thinking by Len Buckingam and John Cundell resulted in much last minute arrangements, lots of telephone calls to members, and agreement by the Council to let us use the cricket pitch as a third lawn so we could fit everything into one weekend. Another hectic day followed on Thursday 27th to mark out the third lawn and make the necessary holes for the hoops.


