She first became involved with organisation of scouting when at the age of 14 in 1941, she and her brother were determined to keep the village of South Mimms' group going when the leaders went off to war.

Over the years Joan held many posts, culminating as District Commissioner. As well as her work with the scouts, she has been a long-term member of St John Ambulance - and became a Serving Sister - one of the highest awards the organisation can give its members.

Indoor Golf Croquet at Soham

The East Anglian Croquet Federation organised the first ever indoor golf croquet tournament for clubs in the region at Soham over the weekend of 14/15th January. It was a great success and each day attracted an entry of 22 players from four different clubs.

Leighton-Linslade was represented by three pairs, namely Yvonne Banks and Diana Phelps, Len Buckingham and Martin Field and John Cundell and Richard Keighley.

They were all keen to try out the extremely fast playing surface of the carpet laid out on the floor of the Ross Peers Sports Centre. The hoops were bolted to heavy steel plates which were let into precisely-cut holes at the appropriate points in the carpet. There was no "give" in the hoops and players found them more difficult to run than typical outdoor hoops.

It was a learning curve (literally on some hoops!) for almost all participants. After each pair had played five timed games against different opposition, the Sunday winners were declared to be from Norwich and the Leighton-Linslade teams came away empty handed but very pleased to have taken part.

We also anticipate playing various board games i.e., chess, dominoes, cards, etc.

We will have the use of the kitchen, fridge, and microwave, there will be constant hot water and the hall will be heated prior to our arrival. When I have some reasonable idea of interested numbers and possible hours each week I shall then be able to obtain an indication of cost, which on good authority I am assured will be very reasonable.

At present we would seem to have some 15 members of our club interested, and we have been promised a further table tennis table by one of our members if needed. The hall will comfortably accommodate two TT tables, a darts area, the billiard table and several tables for board games. With the lack of daytime winter indoor activities of this social nature I feel that this venue will be able to provide many with company, warmth, and an enjoyable winter entertainment.

Two trial sessions have now been agreed with the Council; they are Wednesday 15th February, and Wednesday 1st March, both from 10am to 1pm. Depending upon the response and your comments from these meetings I will make a firm decision as to the viability of the venue and practicability of the idea.
