OPENING OF A NEW ERA?

elcome to the second newsletter of 2006 under the joint Editorship of Richard Keighley and John Cundell. This newsletter is short and sweet as time is of the essence - our pre-season Committee meeting was Thursday 23 March and we are obviously keen to get this to members before the Opening Weekend. So, no pics and social news this time - just what's required to kick the season off and allow you to complete your diaries!

Opening Day

Preparations are well in hand for the opening of the 2006 season on Saturday 1 April at 2pm when Town Mayor Mark Freeman has kindly agreed to strike the first ball in accordance with a well-established and much appreciated tradition. Members are requested to turn up in great numbers to celebrate the occasion.

More Lawn Space

A surefire talking point is the prospect of more lawn space this season. At the Committee meeting on 23 March, Chairman Margaret Brown excitedly announced that the Club had been offered the use of the cricket square for croquet this season as Leighton Foresters had unexpectedly folded after 50 years of playing club cricket. Their misfortune may be our good luck but there is still some negotiation to be done as to our actual basis of occupation. However we are pleased to report that following a brief meeting with John Connew on Saturday 25th March, when Len Buckingham, Martin Field and John Cundell met at Pages Park to mark out the lawns, we were informed by John that a full-size lawn will be marked out on the cricket pitch on Monday 27 and should be available from the start of the season. Furthermore an inspection on the 25 revealed a superb level surface.

The availability of a third lawn gives fresh impetus to the need to recruit new members. At present, we expect to number between 35 and 40 but we will now be in a position to increase membership to nearer 60.

Do you belong to a group which may be interested? Could you display a poster? Have you a friend or friends you would like to bring along?

A new initiative for this season is that those who turn up to try croquet will be offered two to three follow up coaching sessions lasting an hour each at times to suit their convenience and without charge. Any member prepared to assist with this is asked to offer their services to one of the Committee members after the season gets under way. It can be very rewarding to explain the game to newcomers and encourage their participation and even more so if they then join us. New members are the lifeblood of any club and it is hoped that all existing members will do their utmost to help this recruitment initiative. Your Committee cannot do everything and we really do need assistance from all to help build our numbers.
