





Also, all members will find a copy of the Basic Laws of Golf Croquet' leaflet accompanying this newsletter - those attending the course are requested to take a look at this before the Training Day. Hot and cold drinks will be available from the clubhouse!

For those of you on the reserve list or perhaps for whom the date was inconvenient, do not dismay! Jennet Blake, the organiser of the course, has stated that it may be possible to run another one locally in the near future if there is evidence of sufficient demand. Watford may provide the venue as many of their new members would also appreciate coaching. A course is also planned at Blewbury on 30/31st July.

#### **EACF Golf Croquet League**

The Club has entered a team in the South section of the East Anglian League and we now know we have home fixtures against Chelmsford and Burnham-on-Crouch and that we will be playing away at Watford and Letchworth. Check the Diary for the dates fixed so far. See the diary.

If you would like to be considered for selection to the League team, please contact John Cundell (756971) without delay - even if you have already tentatively supplied your name. Our aim is to have a list of about 8 players from which a team of 4 can be selected for each match. Please remember that League team members will not have first choice to play in Friendly fixtures, and will only be considered for Friendlies should it not be possible to raise enough players from other club members. They will though, be eligible for selection to play in all other events - i.e., Grass Roots, Centre Stage, National Trust events.

#### Friendly Matches

We are also in touch with Winslow, Stony Stratford and Luton U3A. If you would like to take part, please sign your names on the Club Notice Board. Preference will be given to those members not involved in league matches.

#### Tournaments 2005

The National Trust is holding both its popular tournaments at Ickworth this year. Doubles Day is Saturday 9th July and Singles Day is Sunday 4th September. The Trust likes as many clubs as possible to take part and our entry is normally restricted to a maximum of 2 pairs and no more than 4 singles players. If you would like to play, please indicate on the Club Notice Board as soon as possible as we must confirm our entry before 30th April 2005. Preference will be given to members who have not taken part in previous years.

Wrest Park is again holding Singles and Doubles tournaments for its group members on 26th June and 24th July respectively. If numbers permit, it may be possible for non-members to play at this superb venue.

A new event is a Ladies Doubles Tournament at Abingdon, the home of Thames Valley Croquet Club. It will be held on Friday 12th August and full details are awaited.

#### **Grass Roots**

Your Committee has decided to hold a club competition on Saturday 11th June starting at 10am. There will be a small entry fee but we hope to attract an entry of 16 players to follow on from the successful day held last year with a smaller entry. The format is progressive doubles, and handicaps do not apply. Watch the Notice Board for more details and the entry form. If there is sufficient interest, the Club will invite the winners to progress to the Regional Final at Northampton.

### The All England Handicap

In 2004 Richard Keighley was fortunate enough to reach

minimum entry of 4 players from a club taking part. They each play each other with the winner going forward to the Area Final at Newport in Essex on 6th August. It would be great if we could be represented again this year and an opportunity to take part will be posted up on the Notice Board at the start of the season.

At the AGM, we decided to approach Leighton-Linslade Town Council to enquire about the prospects of creating a third lawn to play on at Pages Park. The initial response has been encouraging and we have now lodged a more formal application. Watch this space!

As an aside, those of you with fond memories of playing at the OK Corral at Winslow last summer will be relieved to know that they hope to lay a new lawn later this year.

In an effort to recruit new young members, we have adopted the suggestion of Chris Bolton, the Youth Sports Development Officer for South Beds District Council. He is forwarding an offer by us to attend local schools to give a short demonstration of the game of golf croquet. If there is sufficient interest, we may run a tournament on a Saturday morning in May at Pages Park.
