### Down to the Wire!


Our first Friendly fixture against Winslow took place on 9th May at Pages Park.


Please note that the date of our home match against Stony Stratford has been changed to Wednesday 9th June at 10.30am.

**Golf Croquet - Rule Changes** 

The Half Way rule has been changed slightly. Now the opponent decides where the ball past the half way line must be played from. This ball must be moved before the shot following that in which a hoop is scored.

A little more technical is the change to the rule about Striking Faults e.g., double hits, crush shots etc. After such a Fault, the opponent can now decide

if he wants the balls left where they lie or replaced in their original positions. So after that almighty crush shot that scores a hoop and gets the ball down to the next hoop, it is unlikely to be replaced so you can have another go in the next shot.
