## Minutes of a General committee meeting held on 19th February 2004.

- 1. <u>Present:</u> \_ George Lawson (Chair), Margaret Brown, Len Buckingham, Sally Clay, John Cundell, Erica Fogg, Edna Hickman, Val Jeffers, Richard Keighley.
- 2. Apologies: Diana Phelps
- 3. <u>Appointments:</u> Richard Keighley was appointed to fill the vacancy of Secretary until the AGM in November 2004. Margaret Brown was appointed to act as Membership Secretary
- 4. Minutes of the meeting held on 18/09/2003 were approved and signed.
- 5. <u>Matters Arising:</u> a. Fixture Secretary. RK confirmed his willingness to arrange fixtures. LB and JC would deal with teams/fees.
  - b. Equipment. LB still on lookout for a small fridge.
  - c. There were no matters arising from AGM.
- 6. <u>Secretary's Report:</u> a. RK thanked MB for handing over papers in excellent order, together with very helpful notes.
  - b. There was no relevant correspondence to report.
  - c. Newsletter. RK and JC had put together the first edition, which had been favourably received. Future contributions most welcome.
  - d. Sports Council. Some discussion about the merit of attending future meetings, but no decision taken.
- 7. <u>Membership Secretary's Report:</u> 13 members had paid their 2004 subs to date. Last year, the total membership was 32. Reminder in Newsletter needed.
- 8. Treasurer's Report:a. The AGM Raffle had raised £37.20.
  - b. Subs of £540 had been received. Balance of Club Funds:£1525.93.
  - c. Engraving of the trophy had cost £18. LB hopeful that a fridge would be donated.
  - d. Sand blasting the 2 sets of hoops would cost £25.
  - e. Hoops on loan from EACF needed straightening. RK to ask if hoops were for sale.
  - f. LB proposed that full members be allowed to bring along guests to play, free of charge. Agreed, subject to a limit of 3 occasions per member. To be reviewed prior to AGM.
- 9. <u>Handicaps:</u> After discussion, it was agreed to encourage every member to obtain a handicap, so that these could be used in Club sessions as well as in matches and tournaments. Newsletter to publish more info about this.

- 10. <u>EACF</u>: a. AGM at Bury ST Edmunds on 20 March. Decided:- not to attend.
  - b. Golf Croquet Handicap League. New idea.4 players to a team, but not the same for each match. For players with a handicap of 3-6. No fees. Closing date: 29 Feb. Decided:- to take part if there was\_sufficient interest for this to run.
  - c. No immediate prospect of any coaching/referee courses.
- 11. <u>Tournaments:</u> a. National Trust. A Pairs competition would be held at Anglesey Abbey on Saturday 10 July. Entry fee: £5. The Singles would be held at Ickworth on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> Sept. Entry fee: £3 per person. Entry forms to be returned by 30 April 2004.
  - b. Wrest Park. Group members Singles on Sunday 27 June and Doubles on Sunday 25 July. May be opened up to non-members.
  - c. Croquet Marathon 7/8 August at Waterways. Fun Evenings at Wrest Park on 15 June and 21 July(£3).
  - d. Grass Roots. Now run by Patricia Duke-Cox for CA. Minimum entry of 8 per Club, paying £5 each. Club rounds to be completed by 30 June. No date yet for Area Final but Grand Final on 12 Sept at Solihull. Closing date for entries: 26 May.
  - e. Centre Stage. Similar to Grass Roots( handicaps 5/6) but for players with handicaps 1-5. Minimum group of 4, paying £6 each. Final: 11/09. Closing date: 26 May.
  - f. All England Handicap. Minimum entry of 4 at £4 each. One player to go forward to Area Final on 14 August. Probably at Newport, Essex. Final: 25/26 Sept Colchester.
- 12. <u>Club Programme 2004:</u> a. Opening Session. Sunday 18 April at 2pm, or Sat 17 April if Mayor unavailable.
  - b. "Come and Try" Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> May at 2pm. Publicity required.
  - c. Weekly sessions. 10-12 Wed & Thurs, 2-5 Sat, 2-4 Sun. RK to book 2 months ahead.
  - d. May Fayre. Decided:- Not to participate if Invited.
- 13. <u>Friendly Matches:</u> a. Sat 3 July Dunstable U3A at Pages Park
  - b. Wed 2 June Stony Stratford at Pages Park with a return on 13 July. (Dates to be confirmed).
  - c. Sun 9 or 16 May Winslow (Team of 4) at Pages Park, return on 5 Aug (Dates to be agreed)
  - d. No more to be arranged, pending news of League.
- 14. <u>Future Development:</u> MB had raised various matters in her Report to AGM, notably:
  - a. Accommodation . No more news about RAF Stanbridge site.

- b. Training. RK had e-mailed Bill Arliss about the prospects for a refereeing course. This would only run if sufficient demand.
- c. Events. No further action required at present.
- d. Equipment. LB to investigate purchase of 2 mallets for the Club each season.
- 15. <u>Publicity:</u> In the absence of any volunteer for Press/Publicity Officer, it was agreed that MB would promote the Club at U3A meetings\_and offer those interested 2 coaching sessions on Thursday afternoons in May, at £2 per session.

- 16. <u>AOB:</u> a. About 5 members had attended the Mayor's Civic service on 1/2/04.
  - b. Joan Slow had drawn GL's attention to a proposal to develop Pratts's Quarry in Billington Rd. It included a 6 hectare sports Field. Unlikely to happen?
  - c. Garden Party. Possibility to be discussed at next meeting.
  - d. Membership of the Croquet Association by the Club would Provide public Liability Cover of £5 million. However, the CA Sub was calculated on a per capita basis of £6.10. at present, it remained uneconomic for the Club to subscribe.
