"2016 Season Round-up"



elcome to the third newsletter of 2016. This final publication for 2016 covers the whole season. Those of you who have internet access - currently 39 of our 45 members, will no doubt have seen most of the following - so apologies for repetition.

No grand opening ceremony this season as we were waiting for installation of the new fence as the season started. It was certainly worth the wait though - what a huge positive difference it has made to playing at Page's Park - see before and after pics above and below. And we are not finished with the improvements as yet. We are promised by the Council that the steps to assist safe access to lawn three will be completed shortly - and we are have just received a couple of benches from the Council. Some of our gazeboes are nearing the end of their life and we will be looking at replacing them in due course. There are also other ideas in the pipeline to improve our area.

We have enjoyed another busy season with over 30 events taking place - ranging from an excellent win in the National Inter-Club Shield competition and the EACF Inter-Counties Shield, through to B-Level and area tournaments, friendlies, etc. We owe a great debt to those who helped arrange the dates for the fixtures, organised and managed the events and teams, the caterers, those who maintained and set up the lawns, our scorers, launderers, and also to our officers and committee members.

Dunstable Friendly - Home and Home! - 9th May

Our first competition this season was a Friendly with Dunstable CC that is categorised as a 'Home' event for both teams as Dunstable have only one small lawn and it is somewhat difficult for them to stage a competition. Therefore, as well as bringing themselves along, they also bring some cakes for tea!

Dunstable have been pretty unlucky over previous visits to Page's Park where it always seems to rain on them. But not this time as they were greeted with another of the glorious few days we enjoyed at the beginning of May with temperatures just right in the high teens and a pleasant breeze

The visitors all arrived early and we got off to a good start before the 10.00am advertised start time. Dunstable play most of their games over just 7 hoops so 13 hoop games and larger lawns are a bit of a disadvantage for them and they got off to a shaky start on Round 1 as LLCC made a clean sweep — with Dunstable scoring just 14 hoops from their four games. However in Round 2 the visitors scored 17 hoops and won their first game. Improvement continued for them in Round 3 as they scored 19 hoops and again took one of the games at the thirteenth hoop.

At this point lunch was taken. Unfortunately the break ended Dunstable's climbing hoop count as in Round 4 they

Not such a healthy entry this year with just 18 members participating giving nine teams. The players had been split into two groups for the draw, based on their handicaps, with a high handicapper playing with a low handicapper. There were some interesting combinations and the pairs were placed into one block of five and one of four.

The weather was a bit nippy at 12 degrees with a moderate northerly breeze. The playing sequence over five rounds was followed. The smaller entry and odd-numbered block meant that there was inevitable sitting out – however this did allow most games to be played without doubling up and also allowed the advantage of untimed games. 
However, not to be discouraged the six teams set about their games with spirit and the few hardy spectators experienced some pretty good golf croquet.



Hopefully we can repeat this format in future years.


Garden Party and Fun Day - 10th September



Lawn Maintenance

As most members know, the club is now responsible for all maintenance work on the lawns that is required during the closed season - plus the normal work that we undertake during the playing season. The Council groundsmen mow for us once a week during the playing season and mark the white lines. Any other treatment is down to us, either doing it ourselves or paying others to carry out the work.

This winter we hope to improve the general standard of the lawns - particularly lawn one - as well as the usual maintenance work. Tining, top dressing, reseeding and fertilising will be carried out in October. As far as tining is concerned this is considered to be one of the most important tasks in keeping the lawns healthy and reducing the formation of moss. Previously we have been loaned the Council's machine to carry out this work, however the machine is quite awkward and very heavy to handle which is rather beyond the physical capabilities of most of our members. Accordingly we are investigating having this task carried out by a contractor.

Rotary mowing will take place during the winter months as required to keep the level down to around 10-15mm, and further treatment in late February/early March will include more fertilising and weed control - plus moss treatment and scarifying if required. We have a keen group of ten members in our lawn maintenance team, however if any other member is prepared to help, please conatact John Cundell who will gladly add your name to the list.
